Tip: You are a 6th grade teacher. Your students are having difficulty spelling commonly misspelt words. Can you compose a 10 week list of the most commonly misspelt words. Each list should have 10 words. Can you create the list in tabular form?

Problem

Each Weekly Spelling List Doesn't Contain 10 words

Words are repeated across the spelling lists.


